In 2020, 18- to 24-year-olds had higher rates of victimization than any other age group. In this table, victimization means being a victim of rape, sexual assault, robbery, or assault.

Because these rates came from a national survey of reports of victimization provided by living people, they do not include homicide or manslaughter, which would make the rates of victimization higher.

In addition, because not all victims report crimes, it is likely there are more acts of violence than are recorded.
